At Queen of Peace, we were most fortunate to have a physical presence of joy in the person of Joy Johnson. Joy recently retired from Queen of Peace after 29 years of dedicated service. The name Joy is most appropriate for her, for her life story is one of love, faith, trust, compassion and most fittingly, joy.

Joy arrived at Queen of Peace in 1989 for a job interview for a position in the kitchen. Accompanying Joy were her youngest son in a stroller and her four-year-old son in tow. At that time, the kitchen was under the direction of Sister Grace and had a staff of employees responsible for meal preparations for all of our Residents. Sr. Grace hired Joy for the open position in the kitchen. Joy proved to be a very dedicated and competent worker. Unbeknown to anyone other than Sr. Grace, during this time, Joy was facing some very difficult personal challenges and did not have a permanent place to live with her children. Sr. Grace quietly helped Joy out by allowing her children to come and stay in her office at Queen of Peace while Joy worked in the kitchen. Sr. Grace and Joy were quit a team indeed! As time went on, Joy's living arrangements became more stable and she was able to find a safe and secure apartment for herself and her boys. All the while, Joy remained a dedicated employee with a contagious positive attitude. Joy spread the joy she experienced at Queen of Peace to those with whom she came into contact.

She took this concern personally and when she was able, she became a foster parent to several children, three of whom would eventually lose their own mother to AIDS. Joy eventually adopted two of her foster children.

In her retirement, Joy continues to help provide child care to working parents, many of whom are struggling financially. She continues to selflessly give of herself and spreads happiness to those who are fortunate to cross her path. Our Home is a place of Joy. Our dear Joy is truly an inspiring source of it.

Fr. Bob began his ministry at St. Brendan's in Brooklyn upon his graduation from Cathedral College. His public ministry continued in various positions and parishes within the diocese including several years as a teacher of seminarians at Cathedral College. Fr. Bob was also appointed a Parochial Vicar for the diocese. Throughout his ministry, Fr. Bob's passion was evangelization. He took this passion with him in his parish assignments and, as a result, he initiated a wide range of outreach and pastoral programs to meet the needs of an ever-changing parish community. At Queen of Peace, Fr. Bob participates in many of the social events on the calendar and is an avid card player. He is sincerely interested in knowing how everyone he comes into contact with is doing and always has a kind word and a heartfelt blessing to give.

Pope Francis could have been describing Fr. Bob when he spoke of evangelization by saying, "Evangelization is more effective when it is carried out with oneness of spirit... among missionaries and local clergy: this requires courage to seek out ways of working together and offering mutual help in the areas of catechesis and catholic education, as well as integral human development and charity" (September 21, 2014).
