The only change is the location. Instead of singing from the tribune of the chapel, they will be singing in the sanctuary. That will give all the Residents the opportunity to see and hear them on closed-circuit TV.

We thank those of you who have already responded concerning the Coronavirus vaccine and we encourage those who have not done so as yet, to do so as soon as possible. As of today, we have nothing new to report. We are still waiting to know the date when the first group will be vaccinated. We have met with our staff to inform them about it. We, Little Sisters, will take the vaccine. It is our only hope of putting an end to Covid-19 and leading a normal life.

Our Home is "beginning to look a lot like Christmas." The decorations have been up throughout the Home and yesterday, the trees and nativity set (without the Infant!) were set up in the chapel. We look forward to having some poinsettia plants by tomorrow. We're sorry you won't be able to see how beautiful our Home looks inside, even in the midst of a pandemic.
